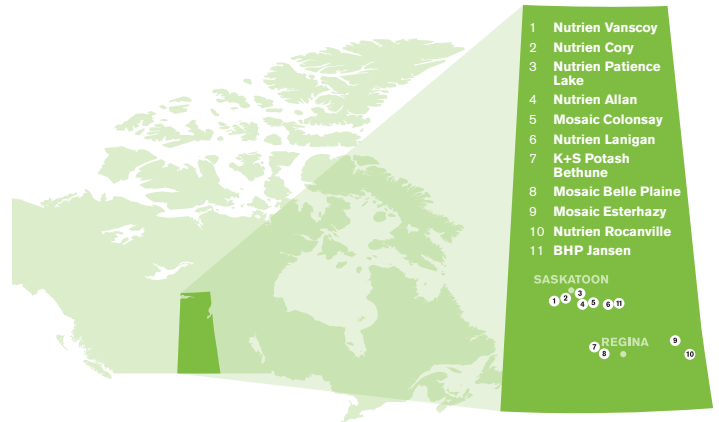


SASKATCHEWAN POTASH

Potash is a critical mineral primarily used as a fertilizer to support plant growth, increase crop yield, disease resistance, and water retention, helping to provide global food security.

Over the past 15 years, Saskatchewan potash companies have invested > \$40 billion in mine operations, creating thousands of jobs.

The average annual salary of employees in the Saskatchewan mining industry is 1.9 times higher than the average annual salary of Saskatchewan workers.

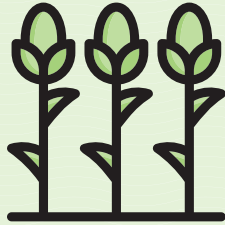

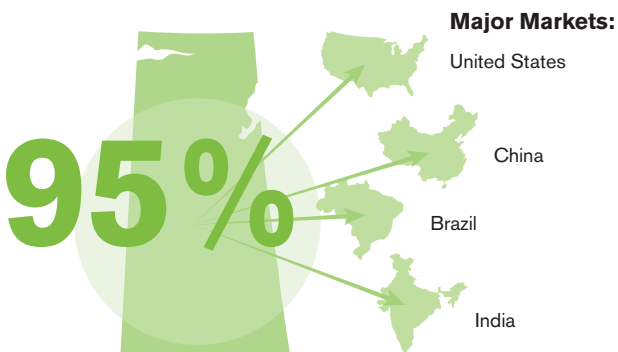
RECORD PRODUCTION

Saskatchewan has the largest and richest potash resources in the world, and could supply the needs of farmers worldwide for several hundred years.

Potash is primarily used as a major nutrient in crop production, and is also used to make industrial products and pharmaceuticals.
